apologize for this inconvenience, and we shall resume our live-streaming and recording of our worship services during the Advent Season.




## **CARES AND CONCERNS**

AN INVITATION FROM THE MISSION AND OUTREACH COMMITTEE

Advent Season is a time when we think especially of others in need. Having endured a pandemic for over 8 months now, we are particularly mindful of the many who are suffering in our midst due to loss, both economic and emotional.

Each year, First Presbyterian Church embraces an opportunity to share the blessings of the Advent Season with those less fortunate than ourselves, Last year, we had wonderful success with the "Angle Tree," and this year the Mission and Outreach Committee has identified another opportunity to assist a project in the Victoria community that is now well established and is growing in its capacity to serve the homeless in this area. This worthy cause is called Promise Pointe, and some may remember that it was one of the charities we featured when we hosted the Presbytery Meeting in October 2019.

Promise Pointe is headed by Sister Rebecca. This organization builds "tiny houses" in which homeless people, who are pre-screened for eligibility, can live independently (at this time four males and four females live on the premises). These eight people are expected to work to earn their keep at Promise Pointe. They work for a minimum wage. Understandably, however, their earnings do not cover some items they need.

This is how we, as a church and Christ's followers, can assist. While these individuals prepare themselves to return as productive members of society, there are certain things they need during this time of transition. The Session of First Presbyterian Church agreed that this is a need we can realistically help to meet. We are proposing, therefore, that the FPC family help support the residents of Promise Pointe during this time of traditional giving and generosity. We are asking you prayerfully to consider the list of items which appears below, and, as you are led by the Holy Spirit, to contribute anything you believe would make life better for these people who are trying their best to improve their situations.

## There are several options:

\*\*\*Pick what you want to buy from the list below. Those items can be brought to the church or otherwise we can arrange for someone to come pick them up from your home. We will deliver them to Promise Pointe, or Sister Rebecca has volunteered to come pick them up from the church office.

List of Suitable Gifts for the Residents at Promise Pointe as provided by Sister Rebecca:

#### Toiletries:

- Canned meat: tuna (no sardines), beef stew, chicken chunks, chicken stews
- Canned soups: variety

- Canned fruit: variety
- Packaged soups: variety
- Packaged pastas: variety
- Peanut butter (crunchy and smooth)
- Snack pack crackers, Oreo cookies, etc.

## A REPEATED CALL FOR HELP FROM CHRIST'S KITCHEN

Christ's Kitchen has again been overwhelmed by an increase in the number of homeless who look to that organization for likely their only meal of the day. At the same time, the customary suppliers who assist Christ's Kitchen in providing desserts for the meals prepared by the volunteers at Christ's Kitchen once again cannot keep up with the demand. *Therefore, Christ's Kitchen volunteers from First Presbyterian Church once more need the congregation's help.* 

Here is a reminder, from Frances Miller and Billy Leske, concerning how each of

us can donate desserts to feed the homeless on Tuesday, the day that FPC's dedicated volunteers prepare to-go lunch boxes for over 900 needy people:

- 1. If you are able to donate store-bought or homemade cakes, cookies, brownies, etc., you can bring them to the church office on Monday or to Christ's Kitchen (611 Warren Ave.) by 8:30 a.m. on Tuesday mornings.
- 2. Individual desserts such as cookies, brownies, lemon bars, etc., should be put in small ziploc storage bags before being delivered. Typical servings per storage bag are 3 to 4 cookies or 2 to 3 donuts, brownies, lemon bars, etc. Cakes or pies should be delivered in disposable, non-returnable containers.



## A FINAL WORD ABOUT INTERNET GREMLINS!

After successfully live-streaming our worship services for three Sundays in a row, we are continuing to experience random, unpredictable degradations in the quality of our transmissions to the point where they become inaudible and unviewable.

We are working to correct our broadcasting problems, but we still experience problems from time to time. Hopefully, we will soon be able to arrive at a permanent, reliable solution.

Meanwhile, we want the members and friends of FPC to know that, as a backup, we will continue to post our worship services on the FPC website and Facebook page within 36-48 hours after each service. The problem is limited to our capability

to live-stream from our Sanctuary.
