

Four years ago, at the time of the last Presidential inauguration, the President of Austin Seminary reminded the students, faculty, and friends of the seminary, that regardless of our emotions, we must remember our loyalty to the God in whom Christians, regardless of our divergent political affiliations, place our faith. For Christians, "In God We Trust" is not a slogan. It is a deeply held confidence in the sovereignty of God. Ours is a God to whom we may turn to pray for the welfare of our nation and for the wisdom of all the nation's leaders, red or blue, black or white, male or female, young or old.

Accordingly, the Seminary President circulated with his comments a prayer for our nation which was written by Woodrow Wilson at another time of great disruption and anxiety in our nation. The prayer is as relevant now as it was four years ago, as relevant now as it was one hundred years ago. May our hearts be strengthened and encouraged as we pray together:

For Our Nation

Almighty God, ruler of all the people of the earth, forgive, we pray, our shortcomings as a nation; purify our hearts to see and love truth; give wisdom to our counselors and steadfastness to our people; and bring us at last to the fair city of peace, whose foundations are mercy, justice, and good will, and whose builder and maker you are; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen
