As was the case all over Victoria, we lost power and water here at the church. But no water pipes burst, and Robert Wyatt informs me that the organ pipes held up alright as well. We did lose water in the HVAC system, however, so when the power came back on, we had no heat until our service contractor was able to refill the boiler and restart it. All is well now, and if you were with us in the Sanctuary last Sunday, you know that we now have plenty of heat.


The biggest disruption caused for us by the storm was the canceling of our Ash Wednesday worship service on Wednesday, February 17, 2021 at 6:00 p.m. It was disappointing to many of us, I am sure, but without power, we had no lights and no Internet connection allowing us to livestream our service. Moreover, Wednesday evening would not have been a good time to be out on the streets of Victoria. We have saved the ashes we were going to use, and we will have a beautiful service next year when, post-COVID, more of us will be able to gather in person.

The Presbyterian Day School also fell victim to the storm. Following the lead of the Victoria Independent School District, the school was closed all of last week. The young disciplines returned to their warm classrooms on Monday, February 22nd, and the education wing is alive once again with the sound of their happy voices.

Finally, you will have noticed that the Church Newsletter did not get published last week. Thank you for understanding our predicament. No power meant no

access to our computers or to our email system. However, on Friday, February 19th, we were able to print the Bulletin for the following Sunday worship service, and we took the opportunity to send those Bulletins to those on our mailing list. It is likely that the Bulletins did not arrive at their destinations until Monday or Tuesday (after our Sunday worship service), but we know that some people watch the service on our website or Facebook page later in the week. If they do, they will have our familiar Bulletin by their side.

- Sunday, March 28th: Palm Sunday
- Friday, April 2nd: Good Friday
- Sunday, April 4th: Easter Sunday

Lent is a solemn time when we recall Christ's passion and crucifixion and prepare ourselves through meditation, contemplation, and other spiritual practices for the redeeming, live-giving Resurrection of our Lord and Savior!



COVID-19 VACCINE APPOINTMENTS VIA THE INTERNET

Do you or a loved one (it does not matter whether they are a member of FPC) need help in trying to make an appointment for a COVID-19 vaccination? If so, please call the church office, and as discussed in our last Newsletter, one of the Elders on the Session will contact you to ask how she or he can help. Session members are able to use their own computers to try to make an appointment for anyone who needs it.

Yesterday (Tuesday), marked the third time we have engaged in this effort, and I am happy to report that, while we are not always successful, so far we have obtained appointments for six members of our congregation!

We are getting good at this, so please let us help you or someone you love. This is the information we need: name; address (including County; it does not have to be Victoria); year of birth; telephone number; and, if you have one, email address.

What we are doing is perfectly permissible from VCHD's perspective, the only requirement being that the vaccine recipient must currently be within eligibility categories "1a" (healthcare workers) or "1b" (over age 65 or otherwise 16 years of age and older with at least one chronic medical condition that puts them at increased risk for severe illness from the virus that causes COVID-19; for further information: <u>https://www.dshs.texas.gov/coronavirus/immunize/vaccine/EVAP-Phase1B.pdf</u>).

Finally, if you have any reservations or anxieties about taking this vaccine (aside from what your doctor made have informed you), I would like you to feel free to discuss those concerns with me. These vaccines are nothing short of God's miraculous gifts to his suffering people. It would be a sin to let gossip, Internet

conspiracists, or other misinformation dissuade any of God's children from accepting such a potentially lifesaving gift.



THE JOY OF GIVING

Usually, it is the Preacher, the Treasurer, or the Chair of the Stewardship Campaign who helps us remember the need for giving in the church that we love so much.
