CONTINUED IMPROVEMENTS TO OUR ONLINE STREAMING

As many among us have noted, from a technology point of view the Coronavirus pandemic forced our church, kicking and screaming, to join the 21st century.

I remember those hasty, anxiety filled days in March 2020 when all of us on the church staff felt frustrated, apprehensive, and confused about how to proceed when the Session made the wise decision to suspend in-person worship in our Sanctuary. Miraculously it seemed at the time, we were able to "resurrect" the church's long-lost Facebook page (last used in 2015, if I recall correctly!). Thankfully, our website had already been updated and modernized, but none of us knew how to record or upload worship services for later viewing on the website.

We scrambled, however, and led I am sure by the Holy Spirit, we learned how to record our worship services using an iPhone, how to post the recorded service on both our Facebook page and our website, and even how to place a copy of our bulletin on the website right next to the recorded worship service to which it pertained. And we learned how to do all this very quickly! All of the church staff was gratified to realize that there was only one Sunday worship service, between the date of the Session's decision and the date of the first posting of our online worship service, that we "skipped" while we learned how to adjust to the new reality of the pandemic.


Since those first panicked preparations, we have come a long way in our technological capabilities. Now, not only do we record our worship services, we also "livestream" them so that visitors and homebound members can watch them at

10:30 a.m. along with those who, under our revised safety protocols, now attend church in person. At the same time, our worship services are also electronically archived so that they can be watch subsequently at the viewer's convenience.

Happily, we have also upgraded from our iPhone-on-a-tripod configuration, which did not allow us to move the camera, to a powerful (yet inexpensive) camcorder. Not only does the new camcorder move to follow the activities during our worship service, it also allows us to zoom in or zoom out to concentrate on various elements of our worship. Finally(!), we believe we have also fixed the problem of the "lag time" prior to our worship services, during which the camera broadcasts scenes from the Sanctuary prior to the commencement of our service.

Still, we continue to strive to improve the production quality of our internet broadcasts, and here is where we really need help from our members who watch our worship services electronically. Often we are unaware of problems with our broadcasts (sound quality, connectivity issues, etc.) unless and until someone mentions them to the church office. Also, because we are amateurs, we appreciate suggestions about how to improve our transmissions and recordings for the benefit of our viewers. Do you like the "opening shots" of the altar? Would you like us to focus more often on the Cross on the rear Chancel wall, on the stained-glass windows, on the congregation?

In short, we would like your help in improving the quality of our worship services when they are viewed remotely by members and visitors. Please don't' be shy! No feelings will be hurt! If you have any suggestions, questions, or ideas about the livestreaming of our worship services, please share them with me, Robert Wyatt, or our Church Administrator, Tasha Wolf. We will bless you for your input!
