During its meeting on Monday night, May 10th, the Session was saddened to learn of the serious illness of one of the granddaughters of FPC's good friends, the Rev. and Mrs. Fred Hobbs. The eight-year old girl, Keimryn Lee, is the daughter of Askaskia Hobbs, whom many of us know through her work at her father's church, Mt. Nebo Missionary Baptist Church.

Keimryn Lee is being treated for pediatric cancer in the Houston Medical Center. We shall pray for the welfare and prompt healing of this dear child. JOIN FELLOW FPC MEMBERS IN SERVICE TO THE HOMELESS AT CHRIST'S KITCHEN

In keeping with a long-standing commitment of service to others, several members of First Presbyterian Church, Victoria meet weekly to help prepare for the Tuesday meals served at Christ's Kitchen. Volunteers from First Presbyterian begin chopping fruit and vegetables for salads as well as cutting and boxing desserts on Monday afternoon between the hours of 1:30 - 4:30 pm. The remainder of our portion of the meal preparation is completed on Tuesday morning beginning at 7:00 a.m. Currently, enough food is being prepared to serve between 500-600 to-go meals. During this time, the safe practice of wearing masks is still observed, and no one (other than volunteers) is allowed inside the building.

If you would like to help by joining in during this food preparation, just come to Christ's Kitchen any time on Monday afternoon between 1:30 and 4:30 pm. Extra hands, in service to the less fortunate among us, are always welcome!



FPC CONTINUES TO SUPPORT BOY SCOUT TROOP 368


