First Scripture Reading: Genesis 1:1-5

P. 1 in the Old Testament

In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters. Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light. And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

Second Scripture Reading: Acts 19:1-7

P. 139 in the New Testament

While Apollos was in Corinth, Paul passed through the interior regions and came to Ephesus, where he found some disciples. He said to them, "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you became believers?" They replied, "No, we have not even heard that there is a Holy Spirit." Then he said, "Into what then were you baptized?" They answered, "Into John's baptism." Paul said, "John baptized with the baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in the one who was to come after him, that is, in Jesus." On hearing this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. When Paul had laid his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came upon them, and they spoke in tongues and prophesied—altogether there were about twelve of them.

Bulletin Cover

Our Bulletin Cover is an oil on wood painting by the Venetian artist, Giovanni Bellini (c. 1435 - 1516). Painted as an adornment to the Garzadori altar by Rocco da Vicenza, it is located in the Santa Corona Church, Civic Museum of Vicenza. Vicenza is a colorful Italian down just to the west of Venice and Padua.

Bellini's sumptuous coloring and fluent, atmospheric landscapes had a profound influence on the Venetian painting school, especially on Bellini's pupils Giorgione and Titian. Painters during this period of the Renaissance were experimenting with symmetry and depth perception. As to the former, notice the "center line" created by the alignment of the dove's beak, John's water bowl, and the body of Christ. As to the latter, notice the hills and mountains in the clearly distant background.

Many contemporary Christians might take issue with this depiction of Christ being baptized by John not by immersion in the Jordan River but by having water poured on his head. The Gospel accounts, however, do not record this detail of Christ's baptism. What they do record is the much more significant appearance of the Holy Spirit marking the holiness of the occasion (Matthew 3:16; Mark 1:10; Luke 3:22; John 1:33).
