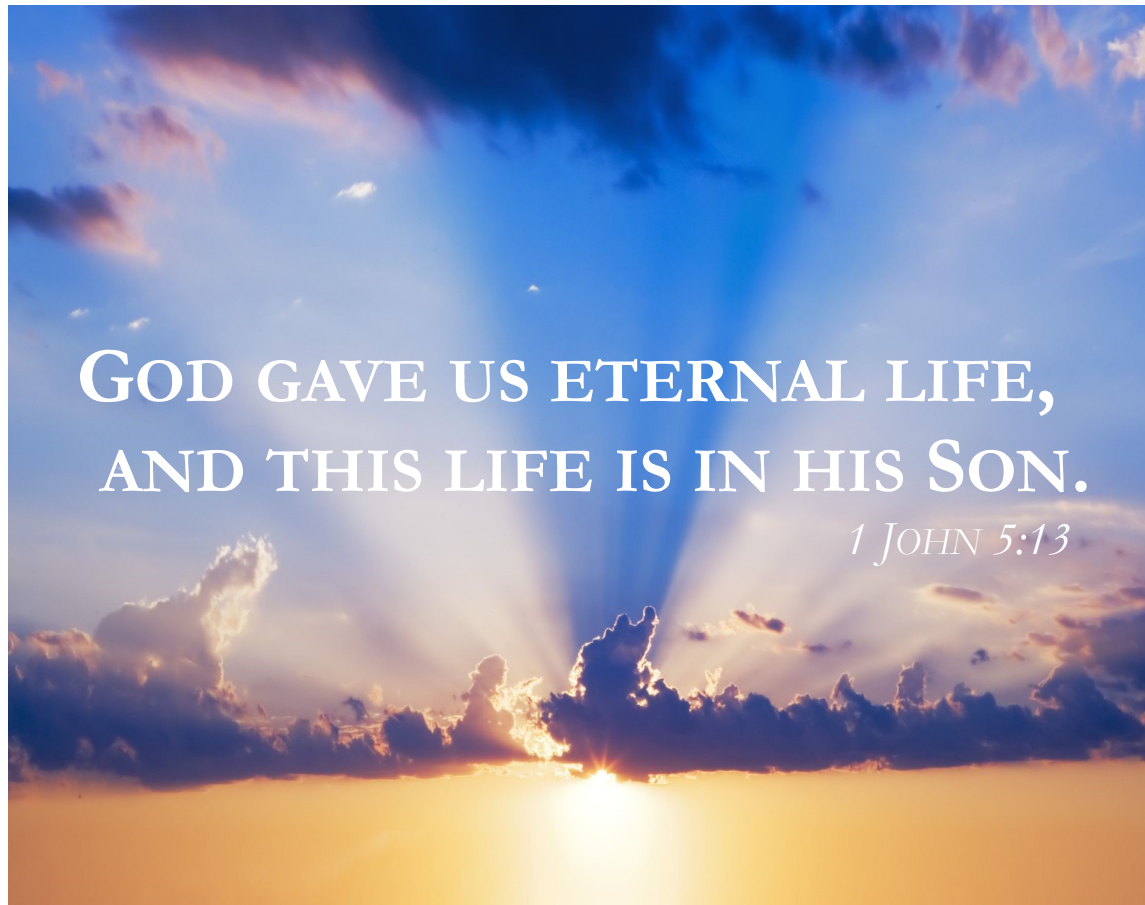

If we receive human testimony, the testimony of God is greater; for this is the testimony of God that he has testified to his Son. Pastor's Notes

Analytical readers of our Scripture lesson from 1 John 5 will point out that in order to believe "God's testimony" (which is greater than "human testimony") we must first believe in God, which is itself a matter of faith. To have faith that God gave us eternal life through his Son requires that we have faith in God. The atheist might argue, therefore, that there is no more empirical evidence of God's testimony than there is of God's existence.

John is not writing for the atheist here, however. He rightly presumes that his audience has faith in God and in God's Son, Jesus Christ. He is talking about having faith in God's promise of eternal life. Thus, John concludes, "I write these things to you *who believe* in the name of the Son of God, so that you may know that you have eternal life" (5:13). John thus reminds us that simply declaring our faith in Jesus Christ is not enough. We must understand why God chose to live among us, incarnate in the same flesh as our own. God's testimony, make manifest in Jesus, is that he came to declare the good news of our salvation and life-everlasting through Jesus Christ our Lord.
