




PLEASE JOIN US FOR WORSHIP ON SUNDAY, JULY 24, 2022, 10:30 A.M.




MEMBERS OF THE

"OFFICE ENTRANCE" TO CHURCH TO BE LOCKED AFTER SUNDAY WORSHIP SERVICE BEGINS

While we have had no incidents yet, during its meeting last Monday evening the Session determined that it would be prudent to lock the doors under the porte cochere (the church's "office entrance") shortly after the beginning of our Sunday morning worship services. These doors would be unlocked promptly at the end of the service. All other doors in the Narthex and

just outside the opposite (east) end of the Sanctuary will remain unlocked as required by the fire code.

Given that the office entrance allows access to the building without anyone in the Sanctuary being aware of it, the Session believes it would be more secure to lock that door while we are worshipping. If you find yourself running late for church (and we have all been there!), please plan to come in the front door of the Narthex.

The numbers for the month of June are staggering when you consider the dramatic increase just from the previous month. Not only just from the total numbers, but the increase in homeless/homeless served, financial assistance served and new clients served - 102. It makes you wonder where are they

coming from; not necessarily geographically, but in a place financially where they are now seeking assistance in one area or another.

On another note: we are in the midst of a box fan distribution drive, a goal to give out 300 fans over the duration of the next few months. Many thanks to those at FUMC and Victoria East High School AVID students for their contributions to support this initiative. I do not have to tell you it's hot out there, so every little bit helps.

Below is an abbreviated mid-year report 2022, just to give you an idea of numbers served and the finances involved:

Total Individuals-	16,146
1 st Time Households-	394

YTD Food (Food Bank/Retail)-	\$26,316.97

Clients come on a once-a-month basis, while our homeless population is served on a daily basis. *All services are provided free*.
