Second Scripture Reading: Hebrews 11:29-2:2

P. 226 in the New Testament

By faith the people passed through the Red Sea as if it were dry land, but when the Egyptians attempted to do so they were drowned. By faith the walls of Jericho fell after they had been encircled for seven days. By faith Rahab the prostitute did not perish with those who were disobedient, because she had received the spies in peace.

And what more should I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets, who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, obtained promises, shut the mouths of lions, quenched the power of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, were made strong out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight. Women received their dead by resurrection. Others were tortured, refusing to accept release, in order to obtain a better resurrection. Others suffered mocking and flogging and even chains and imprisonment.

They were stoned to death; they were sawn in two; they were killed by the sword; they went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, persecuted, tormented— of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts and mountains and in caves and holes in the ground.

Yet all these, though they were commended for their faith, did not receive what was promised, since God had provided something better so that they would not, apart from us, be made perfect.

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God.

Pastor's Notes

On June 23, 2018, a young soccer team was rescued from the Tham Luang Nang Non cave in northern Thailand. Twelve members of the team, boys aged 11 to 16, and their 25-year-old assistant coach entered the cave after a practice session. Shortly thereafter, heavy rainfall partially flooded the cave system, blocking their way out and isolating them over a mile inside the mountain. After a massive international effort, all 13 of the trapped victims were rescued in a daring effort which lasted over three days, July 8-10, 2018. The picture on our Bulletin cover shows the rescue staging area at the mouth of the cave.

What is it that both attracts and terrifies us about stories of people trapped in a cave or mine? Is it our fears of suffocation, being crushed, or starving to death that give us nightmares? I believe such stories also carry with them an awful dread of isolation. Those trapped in the earth are surrounded by a consuming darkness and a terrible sense of loneliness, abandonment, and separation. Although we may never have been trapped in a cave, we all have known moments of unbearable loneliness, abandonment, and separation in our lives—moments that are sometimes of our own making.

Christians have forever had to address these dark feelings during our journeys of faith. The writer of the Letter to the Hebrews offers faith and hope in Jesus Christ to conquer our fears. If Jesus Christ is our rescuer (or shall we say, Savior!), then our faith and our hope are the lifelines in our darkest times that lead him to us and us back into the light. Whether we find ourselves in the deepest darkness of or souls or in the light and joy of Christian fellowship, by God's grace, we are never abandoned; we are never alone.
