2023 STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN IS UNDERWAY!

Today, the day we routinely circulate our weekly Newsletter, is also the day we have mailed to each of the members and good friends of FPC our 2023 Stewardship Campaign materials. Look for your envelope which will contain a letter from your pastor, a synopsis of the church's finances through June 30, 2022, a pledge card, and some information about giving (which, in its broadest sense, consist collectively of time, talent, and of course treasure).

During our Congregational meeting on July 17, 2022, members of the Session wanted to make the case for pledging as well as giving. Of course, your financial gifts to the church are the most important aspect of funding our operations and our missions. If we cannot pay the light bill, then we will have to close the doors.

After that, however, pledging becomes the most important aspect of managing the funds we may expect to receive over the course of the calendar year. Being able to reasonably anticipate the amount of financial support the church will receive during the year is the most useful tool the Session has to be

good stewards of your charitable giving. With pledge cards from all the faithful members and friends of our church, the Session can better budget for the church's expenses and allot appropriate amounts for our missions and outreach. Without a reliable budget, the Session is forced to be extremely cautious, and so the church might have to forego mission and outreach opportunities in the early part of the year, only to learn later in the year that we had, in fact, received sufficient funds to participate in those opportunities which are now lost to us.

If you are willing to support our church, but reluctant to turn in a pledge card, please ask yourself why. Surely, you want to help the Session be good stewards of your donations, but maybe there is something holding you back from sharing with us a projection of your financial support.

In the event you are concerned about privacy, allow me to assure you that for the five years I have been your pastor, the amount of an individual's or a family's pledge has been known only to God, the donor, and the church's Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer. Your pastor and members of the Session receive cumulative financial reports, but none of that data is tied to specific individuals. Hence, if you subsequently need to reduce or suspend (or, of course, increase!) your pledge, you need only mention this to the Treasurer who keeps such information is strictest confidence.

This year, our Stewardship Campaign will be very intentional and focused. During our Sunday worship services and at other times, you will be hearing reports on how the money you contribute to FPC is being used to support various charities in the Crossroads area. We will also be posting periodic information about our progress toward meeting next year's anticipated operational and mission expenditures.

If you have any questions or suggestions, financial or otherwise, about how we can best continue *Our Journey Forward*, please speak with any member of our Session, with our Treasurer, Jim Stokes, or with me. The success our Stewardship Campaign is now in your hands. May your hearts respond generously!



NEVER LET YOUR GUARD DOWN: INTERNET SECURITY IS SERIOUS!

It's happening again! Fraudsters and criminal have been trying to convarious church members into making phony charitable contributions.

More than one member of our congregation has reported to the church office that they have received a text from "Pastor Jim," asking for a "quick favor." A reply to the text prompts a return message asking the recipient to buy an Amazon gift card for a sick child or some other poor person in need. Those who have reported these texts have been wise enough *not* to send any money, although they did say how "authentic" the original texts appeared. So, no harm done, as far as we can tell.

Still, be careful out there! If Pastor Jim asks you for a favor in a text or email, it will not be to give money to someone you do not know. Moreover, if you do receive such a suspicious request, please let the church office know. We want to keep track of how serious a problem this might be.







"OFFICE ENTRANCE" TO CHURCH TO BE LOCKED AFTER SUNDAY WORSHIP SERVICE BEGINS

While we have had no incidents yet, during its meeting last Monday evening the Session determined that it would be prudent to lock the doors under the porte cochere (the church's "office entrance") shortly after the beginning of our Sunday morning worship services. These doors would be unlocked promptly at the end of the service. All other doors in the Narthex and just outside the opposite (east) end of the Sanctuary will remain unlocked as

required by the fire code.

Given that the office entrance allows access to the building without anyone in the Sanctuary being aware of it, the Session believes it would be more secure to lock that door while we are worshipping. If you find yourself running late for church (and we have all been there!), please plan to come in the front door of the Narthex.
