#### NATIONAL GRANDPARENTS DAY

During a White House Conference on Aging in 1961, Jacob Reingold (1916-1999), a leader in caring for the aged, was inspired by a speech concerning the "new image of the aged" which focused on recognizing the role of millions of older Americans who are grandparents. That same year, in the retirement center in which he served as an officer (Hebrew Home), Mr. Reingold instituted a day specifically honoring grandparents. By 1963, the celebration became an official holiday in the borough of the Bronx, New York.

Marian McQuade (1917-2008) was an advocate for the elderly in West Virginia, and it was through her efforts that Grandparents Day was officially recognized in her home state in 1973.

The work of Mr. Reingold, Ms. McQuade, and others culminated in 1978 when the U.S. Congress passed legislation proclaiming the first Sunday after Labor Day as "National Grandparents Day." President Jimmy Carter signed the presidential proclamation which began the observance of this special day of recognition and celebration for grandparents and those who have the heart of a grandparent.

Of all the Bulletin covers your pastor has chosen these past several years, I have to say that this one-- the one I have picked for National Grandparents Day-- has to be among my favorites.

The picture of a grandfather ("Granddad") going for a walk with his granddaughter ("Princess") needs no title, and no pastor's notes can adequately capture the sincerity of this precious scene. Princess is headed down the road, without a care in the world. She is holding Granddad's hand, and that is all she needs to feel secure.

The road that Granddad and Princess are on is long, and I am willing to bet that if they go much further, Princess will need to be carried—perhaps Granddad will lift her up on his shoulders. We all need to be carried down the road of life from time to time, do we not?
