You shall eat your fill and bless the LORD your God for the good land that he has given you.

"Take care that you do not forget the LORD your God by failing to keep his commandments, his ordinances, and his statutes that I am commanding you today. Pastor's Notes

Our Bulletin cover, a copy of an image used by Knox Presbyterian Church, Pasadena, California, reminds us that today is World Communion Sunday, a day of worship set aside for the ecumenical celebration of the Lord's Supper by Christians around the world.

World Communion Sunday was originally the brainchild of the Rev. Dr. Hugh Thompson Kerr, pastor of Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburg. The idea occurred to him in 1930 during his tenure as the moderator of the General Assembly of what was then known as the "northern" Presbyterian Church. The idea was formally adopted in 1936 by the Presbyterian Church as a denominational practice. In 1940, the Federal Council of Churches (the precursor to the National Council of Churches) endorsed the first Sunday in October as World Communion Sunday and began to promote it to Christian churches worldwide.

As the world descended into World War II, the idea of a worldwide celebration among Christians to commemorate Christ's vision of peace and harmony by "remembering him" in common communion gathered traction and continues to this day. As new wars rage in Ukraine and elsewhere around the world, let us pray for peace as we await the final peace of Christ's return in victory.
