

RESULTS OF OUR CONGREGATIONAL MEETING ON SUNDAY, OCTOBER 9, 2022

At our congregational meeting held immediately following our 10:30 a.m. worship service on Sunday, October 9, 2022, Ruling Elder Dawn Neel presented the names of five individuals that a subcommittee of the Session proposed be elected to serve on a Congregational Nominating Committee (CNC). This CNC is being constituted for the purpose of reporting back to the congregation with the names of individuals they will nominate to serve on the Session for designated terms in succession of current Elders who are rotating off at the expiration of their respective terms on December 31, 2022. The Elders who terms expire on that date are Dawn Neel, Susan Salinas, and Gayla Whitaker.

Two members from the Session were nominated to serve on the CNC: Dawn Neel and Gayla Whitaker. Three members from the congregation were also nominated: Jack Kleinecke, Marth Tarkington, and Bill Wilkinson. By an overwhelming majority of the vote of the members of the congregation present at the meeting, these five individuals were elected as the members of this CDC.

Please pray for these good folks as they now enter into a time of discernment to consider whom they will nominate to be elected to serve on the Session, commencing January 1, 2023. As we continue with *Our Journey Forward*, we are looking for able leaders to help guide us into the future, a future we are confident is full of opportunity and blessings.

- 2. \$92,128



I once had a mentor, well, my boss and my mentor, who had an uncanny knack for finding the smallest typographical errors in any memorandum or contract I gave him. At first, I was always mortified when that happen, fearing that he would judge me "less than perfect" and thus criticize me harshly. For a while, he let me stew with that attitude, wanting to ensure, I imagine, that as a lawyer I always strived as hard as possible to prepare a "perfect" document— that I always strived to "do my best."

Eventually, however, he let me off the hook. When I once again reacted in honor to a miniscule typo that he had found, he finally put me at ease when he said, "That's alright, Jim. All my pencils have erasers." Well, how about that?! He was confessing to not being perfect either! After that, I still worked hard to do my best, but I was less stressed because I knew that mercy was available if and when I failed.

With time, I found my mentor's compassionate remark to be spiritually refreshing. God does not insist upon perfection among his beloved children, any more than we expect perfection among the children whom we raise. Forgiveness is a type of "spiritual eraser" that we have all been given, thanks to God's mercy and grace. One iteration of the Lord's prayer might be "Erase our mistakes, as we erase the mistakes of others!"

The faithful worshipers here at FPC, Victoria, have all been equipped with divine erasers. Those of us who write and publish the Newsletter are always grateful for that!
