

Pastor's Notes

When Jesus tells the penitent criminal beside him, "Truly I tell you, *today* you will be with me in Paradise" (Luke 23:43), we ordinarily do not pause over the timing of the promise. Jesus and the criminals crucified beside him will die together, and two of them will be in Paradise thereafter.

In the language of the New Testament, however, the word Jesus uses (σήμερον; sēmeron) is less temporal than simply "today" or "before midnight." This is same word Jesus uses, for instance, when he teaches us to pray, "give us *this day* our daily bread." Thus, "today" may indeed mean "now" in a general sense, but it is not confined to a specific instance as, for example, a date on a calendar.

As we grow in our faith, as we struggle to resolve our "unbelief" with God's help, Jesus promises us more than one "today." There are many times when we need our daily bread, there are many times when we ask Christ for forgiveness, and there are many times when we ask our triune God for the assurance, in faith, of eternal life with him in the kingdom of heaven, a paradise to be sure. Every day is "today" for a Christian. Every day is "this day" when we may draw closer to our king-- our Lord and Savior. Every day is a day to celebrate the Reign of Christ!
