#### First Scripture Reading: Genesis 2:15-17, 3:1-7

The LORD God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it. And the LORD God commanded the man, "You may freely eat of every tree of the garden; but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall die."

Now the serpent was more crafty than any other wild animal that the LORD God had made. He said to the woman, "Did God say, 'You shall not eat from any tree in the garden'?" The woman said to the serpent, "We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden; but God said, 'You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree that is in the middle of the garden, nor shall you touch it, or you shall die.'" #### Pastor's Notes

In searching for an appropriate illustration for this morning's Bulletin cover, your pastor had a wide selection of art from which to choose. Some portrayals of Jesus facing the Devil's temptations in the wilderness showed Jesus exalted and triumphant. An evil apparition representing Satan was being vanquished as Jesus stood strong and resilient, often with his arms held out in conquest. Christ the Victor.

Other portrayals were more contemplative, showing Jesus deep in meditation and prayer, as if calling on some divine resource-- surely, God himself. Often the devil was missing in these paintings, indicating that perhaps Jesus was summing his strength prior to his encounter with temptation or otherwise indicating that perhaps Jesus was deep in prayerful gratitude after he had conquered the Devil. Christ the Pious.

On this occasion, however, your pastor's eye was caught by the painting on our cover, entitled "In the Wilderness." It is a work by the contemporary artist Ron Decianni (<u>umu,facebook.com/RonDiCianniArtistsCircle/</u>), and in my mind it speaks to Jesus' fatigue after facing the Devil. Christ the Exhausted! I like this portrayal because, if we are honest, facing temptation is exhausting regardless of whether we succumb to sin or whether we successfully resist it until the Devil returns (as he always does). During Lent we are reminded that no human strength is capable of resisting temptation and sin on every occasion. Let us remember that we need Christ's power to help us resist the power of evil, and we are always in need of Christ's forgiving grace when we fail.
