


JOIN US FOR WORSHIP THIS SUNDAY, MARCH 12, 2023, 10:30 A.M.

Below is the reflection for the Fourth Sunday in Lent. We hope that you are comforted and inspired by these words on your Lenten journey.

Empower Servant Leadership

Philippians 2:3-8, NRSV

Do nothing from selfish ambition or empty conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. Let each of you look not to your own interests but to the interests of others. Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be grasped, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, assuming human likeness. And being found in appearance as a human,

he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death— even death on a cross.

This Scripture represents the nature and attitude that we should focus on cultivating as followers of Jesus. As the Amplified version puts it in verse 3, "Don't act from selfishness or pride, but instead, through humility, consider each other as better than yourselves". I believe that if we are attempting to possess the perspective of Christ, we need to demonstrate His humility. But if we are honest with ourselves, we have been unable to differentiate humility from servitude. Too often, people of color have been warned that there will be serious repercussions if they do not remain in "their place". Similarly, women have often been belittled and expected to be obedient to their husbands. Thus, this Lenten season, the real question that comes to mind is how do we self-reflect on our own intentions? How do we put into perspective the humility of Christ?

Humility is a characteristic of empowered servant leadership which involves recognizing that one does not have all the answers or power, and that others may possess more knowledge and aptitude. By admitting one's own fallibility and recognizing the boundaries of one's knowledge, the servant leader helps to create a learning environment in which colleagues, and folks within the congregation can gain knowledge through their own attempts and from others.

We are not called to be Jesus, but to have the same motivation for our actions. The attribute of humility comes out of a wellspring of knowing oneself and allowing others to be themselves. Humility is other-centered, rather than self-centered. We learn a lot more when as we seek to live out our calling in partnership with others rather than alone.



OUR JOURNEY FORWARD: YOUR NEW MISSION STUDY TASK FORCE BEGINS ITS WORK

Our session has approved the creation of a Task Force to begin a prayerful study and discernment about the current health, spiritual life, and future of First Presbyterian Church of Victoria, Texas. This is a daunting task, but the challenge was quickly accepted by faithful members of our church. The members of your Mission Study Task Force are:

Your Task Force held its first meeting on Saturday, March 11, 2023, during which we began to discuss our methodology on how we will proceed with this study. The first task is to proceed with a data-based discernment of our heritage, who we are, current mission and outreach activities, local community demographics, our congregation demographics, Presbyterian Women, Presbyterian Day School, and our staff.

The second task is how your Task Force will conduct a survey to gain a better understanding of the views of our church's congregation. The development of technology and the ease on how to implement so much of what we do today led your Task Force to decide to use an electronic survey of the congregation. We currently send 91 newsletters by email on a weekly basis, with an additional 12 newsletters delivered by the US Mail. While your Task Force realizes that the results of the survey may be difficult to accept, the results may also be highly enlightening. It is a process that we believe we need to complete. Your help is urgently needed and greatly appreciated.

You will receive the survey via email, if we have your email address, on Tuesday, March 21, 2023. Please watch your mailbox for a message from *fpcofvictoria.org*. It will be sent from the same email address from which you receive the weekly newsletter. Please check your spam box if you don't see it. Those of you who receive your newsletter by US Mail, you will also get the survey in the same manner. It will include a self-addressed envelope for you to return your completed survey to the church office or you can simply bring it to church with you the following Sunday. Please feel free to discuss any concerns or issues with any of your Task Force members.

While we do not like deadlines, your Task Force would like your responses either by email or US Mail by **March 31, 2023**, to help us move forward with this important work.

Continuing the momentum generated during your Task Force's last meeting, we will meet again on **Monday, March 20, 2023, at 6:00 p.m.** in the Session conference room.

Please pray for your Task Force, please help us in this critical mission, and if you have any ideas, questions, or suggestions about how we may move forward, empowered by the Holy Spirit, to continue this church's 182 years of Christian worship and service in this community, please share your thoughts with any of the Task Force members.

PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN MISSION PROJECT APRIL 2023 - THE VINE SCHOOL


Items needed by The Vine School are:


- * Disinfectant Wipes
- * Dry Erase cleaner (such as Mr. Clean Magic Eraser sponges).


 Dry Erase cleaning sprays and wipes are available at Walmart,






PERIODIC FPC FINANCIAL REPORT

(JANUARY 1 THROUGH JANUARY 31, 2023)

Thank you to everyone who provided feedback on the copy of the FPC Financial Report that we published in last week's Newsletter. The basic reaction was that while the information was appreciated, there was too much of it!

After further discussion, therefore, the Finance Committee has decided that, while the information in the Report was helpful for the Committee's careful monitoring of the church's finances, the basic detail with which the congregation was interested was simply whether or not our income was sufficient to meet our expenses. Accordingly, below is a newly formatted chart containing only that basic information.

Our Finance Committee, Session, and Treasurer (Dawn Neel) are working tirelessly to be good stewards of your tithes and offerings. Part of that work involves providing the members and friends of our church with current and transparent financial information. Therefore, we continue to welcome your input and suggestions about how we can best accomplish those goals.
