

As your pastor has mentioned in this Newsletter before, I sense a quickening (dare we pray, a revival?!) in our midst as we have worshipped and celebrated through the first calendar quarter of 2023. The Lord is good, and his steadfast mercy lasts forever!

More importantly than increased giving and increased attendance, the level of participation by our members in the work of our church has increased dramatically. Our Mission Study Task Force, led by Donald Anderson, is working tirelessly to discern the will of the Holy Spirit as we continue *Our Journey Forward*.

Other Session Committees (which are comprised of Session members and members of the congregation alike) have also approached their tasks with renewed vigor. Session and congregation members have stepped forward to renew our adult Sunday School class and to start a Sunday School class for youth. Have you noticed? If so, why not share a word of encouragement with those who serve the church and God's kingdom? Better yet, if you have not already, why not join them now?!

If you are already involved in this work, may God bless you! If you feel called to help us, please let your pastor or someone on the Session know-- our names and the committees we chair are listed on the back of the worship bulletin every Sunday. Even if you are unable, due to health or other circumstances, to actively participate in committee work, you can always pray for the wisdom of our Session, the success of our committees, and the growth of our church in service to the Lord.

Finally, a request for prayers for the Session is always in order. We are

aware of the many needs of our church, and we are struggling to meet them with wisdom, faith, and courage. We try to mention the highlights of the Session's work from time to time in this Newsletter, but I would remind the congregation that Session minutes are available for review at any time by any member of our church.

At our Session meeting on Monday evening, April 10th, we were faced with a particularly difficult issue which is representative of some of the hard choices and bold decisions that we are required to make as we maintain, lead, and seek to expand our church with the limited resources available to us. As a matter of faithful stewardship, we carry Casualty and General Liability Insurance to protect our property and personnel (the Presbyterian Day School included). Faithful Session members before us have always maintained this coverage, and it was thanks to their foresight and the hard work of the Hurricane Harvey Task Force that we were able to restore our church with proceeds from the insurance coverage we had at that time.

Since Hurricane Harvey, however, the cost of the church's insurance has soared (our premiums have more than doubled in 5 years). Our insurance premiums for calendar year 2023 will be approximately \$38,500. Moreover, the deductible we must bear for any wind- or hail-storm damage to our property has skyrocketed as well. Through good fortune at the time, our deductible for this type of damage as a result of Hurricane Harvey was \$2,000. That same deductible in 2023 is \$450,000! Last year, we were able to afford a "supplemental" insurance policy to reduce that deductible to \$75,000, but the premiums for that policy cost the church approximately \$15,500. This policy will now expire on April 21, 2023. If we were to renew that same policy, it would now cost approximately \$16,500.

At its last meeting, your Session carefully considered whether to renew this supplemental policy. The Finance Committee had previously discussed the matter in connection with the preparation of our 2023 operating budget and, after prayerful consideration, determined that we did not have the financial resources to renew the policy, as desirable as it would be to do so. Through the first calendar quarter of 2023, our cash flow has been (although barely) sufficient to meet our expenses, but still, until we re-examine the budget at midyear, we are anticipating a \$22,000 deficit in 2023. To have included this insurance premium in the budget would have increased our budget deficit to \$39,000. While it is true that we are praying that our pledges and offerings will rise through the year sufficiently to cover our current expenses (and eliminate our deficit), it seems premature and thus unwise to anticipate an additional \$39,000 in income just yet. Moreover, while it is also true that we have approximately \$75,000 remaining in the church's "rainy day funds" kept at the Texas Presbyterian Foundation, the Budget Committee believed it would not be prudent to commit over 20% of that fund to pay for this increased insurance. Other contingencies may well arise, and we were fearful, having already reduced these funds by some \$50,000 in 2022, to reduce them even further.

Still, given the seriousness of this decision, the Session reviewed it once more before our renewal deadline occurs. The consequences of our decision are obvious. If we experience one or more serious weather events in the coming 12 months, we will be faced with a \$450,000 wind- and hail-storm deductible for each occurrence. If we purchase the additional insurance, and need it, it will be the wisest investment the Session will have ever made. If we don't purchase the additional insurance, and need it, it could mean the financial ruin of our church.


The Session's decision was not unanimous, but a substantial majority concluded that at this time in the history of our church, we simply could not afford to purchase this supplemental insurance. We believe that we have a higher priority for the limited financial resources available to us at this time and that, while we all devoutly wish we could purchase this insurance, we do not believe it to be the wisest use of the congregation's money.

While we pray fervently that God will spare us harm, in the event of catastrophe we are prepared to search for ways forward at that time. Perhaps this will be how God chooses either to redirect or bring to a close (but hopefully not) the long and faithful service of First Presbyterian Church in the Victoria community. Whatever happens, may we always be grateful to God for all that we and our predecessors have been able to accomplish in God's name, and may we find the will and the way to continue our efforts, come what may!

In faith, we also pray, if our building is damaged, that perhaps not all will be lost after all. If needed, perhaps funds to cover our insurance deductible can be obtained (by grant or by loan) from outside sources. Perhaps some of our more affluent members would be willing to help. Your pastor hopes that we are never faced with this dilemma, but it would be foolish to pretend that it might not ever happen. This was a hard decision made by courageous members of your Session who love this church with all their hearts and who grieve to leave it at the mercy of the elements. Still, this church belongs to all of us, and so we ask that if any members of the church question the wisdom or sincerity of our decision, please speak up now while we have time to reconsider. Speak up now, and please do not second-guess us if calamity befalls our property. We made a decision that we believed was in the best interests of the church when we made it, but we are still willing to reconsider.

Finally, perhaps there is a member (or more than one) who has the means and the will to help us meet this expense this year. If 4 members quickly stepped forward with supplemental pledges of \$4,000 each, we could cover this expense in 2023-2024 as we work to strengthen our income in 2024. Indeed, our prayer is that next year, as a result of our efforts this year, we can resume this coverage to protect our property.

If you would like to contribute (or even loan?) all or some significant amount of money to the church for the purpose of obtaining this coverage while we work towards that end, please speak to your pastor, Dawn Neel (Treasurer), or Jim Stokes (Ass't Treasurer) *as soon as possible*. Might you be an agent of blessing and protection for our church at this time of great need and possible danger? Take that question to the Lord in prayer!



A CHANGE OF FORMAT IS COMING FOR OUR

WORSHIP BULLETIN

The Worship Committee has received comments from some in the congregation that the worship bulletin is too cluttered with unnecessary text. They make the valid point that we only started including copies of the Scripture and lyrics to the hymns as a result of COVID when our safety protocols involved removing pew Bibles and hymnals from the Sanctuary. Those books have been returned, however, so why do we still need to print a large worship bulletin?

The Worship Committee always welcomes this kind of input. So, next Sunday you will notice that our worship bulletin will consist of only 4 pages, instead of 8 or 12 (4, 8, and 12 pages are the only printing options we have; we cannot, for example, print a 5-page bulletin).

So, look for a less cluttered, more compact worship bulletin when you arrive at church next Sunday, and let us know what you think! Meanwhile, for those who receive the bulletin by mail, we will continue to send you the worship bulletin in the format with which you are familiar-- the format that contains Scripture and hymn lyrics. We appreciate that while everyone will have a Bible at home, they may not have a copy of the hymnal. Moreover, for those with limited mobility, they may appreciate the convenience of an "all-in-one" bulletin without having also to manipulate a Bible and/or hymnal.

We will see how this goes for a while, as we await more feedback. Also, to be clear, this is not an economy measure; it is a convenience matter. It costs us less than \$0.30 to print a worship bulletin on our office copier.

of happy PDS students.




SUNDAY, APRIL 30TH


NEWS FOR THE NEW PW STUDY YEAR


CURRENT COPIES OF "THESE DAYS" HAVE ARRIVED

Our Finance Committee will be meeting soon to determine if this is merely a timing issue or whether we need to consider even greater (likely painful) reductions in our expenses going forward.

Meanwhile, however, so far we are fortunate to have sufficient cash flow in April (which includes Easter Sunday) to not be in immediate difficulty. Still, if you have been 'tardy' in keeping your pledge-giving current, please help us by catching up as soon as you can!
