HOW DO YOU LIKE THE REVISED FORMAT OF OUR WORSHIP BULLETIN?



This Sunday you will notice that the shortened bulletin contains an insert. That is necessitated by the fact that the hymn in question is not in our hymnal, plus we did not have enough space to print it in the shortened bulletin. As a reminder, given the publishing software we use, bulletins of 4, 8, and 12 pages are the only printing options we have (we cannot, for example, print a 5-page bulletin).

As we continue to use this shortened format while we await more feedback from the congregation, please let us know your thoughts. NEWS FOR THE NEW PW STUDY YEAR




CURRENT COPIES OF "THESE DAYS" HAVE ARRIVED
