
DEAR FPC MEMBERS AND FRIENDS.

PERIODIC FPC FINANCIAL REPORT TO THE CONGREGATION (JANUARY 1 THROUGH APRIL 30, 2023)


Through the first four months of 2023, church revenue improved in April to the point where a negative cash-flow of \$10,678 at the end of March was reversed into a positive of \$3,162 at the end of April. Obviously, a lot of this has to do with the timing of our collections versus the timing of our payments, but anytime we are collecting more than we are spending is a good day at the church house.

But now a cautionary word based on experienced. Historically, collections decline during the summer months, both in large churches and small. Attendance drops as folks go on vacation and forget to send in their tithes and offerings while they are away. Unfortunately, given our razor-thin financial circumstances, any

decline in revenue risks our having to dig into our savings accounts to keep the lights on.

Hopefully, however, among this vigilant and faithful congregation, we will not see this customary "summer lull." Please mail us your offering if you are going to be away, or drop two offerings in the plate to cover, in advance, the time you will be away!

The Finance Committee is very grateful for the faithful stewardship of this congregation. We, in turn, promise to be faithful stewards of the church's financial resources.
