VCAM NEEDS OUR ASSISTANCE

As the sweltering south Texas heat beats down and the cost of groceries continues to go up, let's remember to support those less fortunate in our community.

Victoria Christian Assistance Ministry (VCAM) continues to serve a steadily increasing number of clients daily. The number of households served in the month of May climbed to 1,364, which is over 300 more households than May of 2022. Some of the services provided to these families include food boxes, clothing, prescription assistance, and water/utility assistance. VCAM also purchased and is distributing over 100 box fans to families in need.

A total of 127 homeless clients visited VCAM in May to receive over 600 services including daily food bags, toiletries, laundry cards, clothing, and prescription assistance.

Food purchases through May of this year have totaled \$48,682, which is more than double the cost of food purchased during this same period in 2022.

Let's see if the FPC Family can help! Let's fill the VCAM grocery cart to the brim in the month of July!

Suggested items are:


-canned fruits and vegetables, tuna -non-perishable pantry items such as peanut butter, dried beans and rice etc...

-bags of apples and oranges

-individual packages of peanut butter and crackers, granola bars and pull tab cans of fruit or pudding -bottled water

-small travel size toiletries such as body wash, shampoo, deodorant, toothpaste and toothbrushes

Plan to gather with friends at the end of summer to share your love of reading and to trade reviews of *The Blue Castle*.




Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these". Matt 19:14

Our actual "50th" was June 6, 2020, but we all remember the pandemic that gripped the world back then. Such an auspicious occasion seemed to warrant a little extra time to celebrate, even if it was delayed by three years!

We are especially grateful to Robert Wyatt and Erica Colding who took

on extra responsibilities and worked extra hard both before and while we were away. Happily, each of them will also be taking their own vacations later this month, and I am glad that they will soon experience the rest and relaxation that Sally and I were able to enjoy.
