P. P 162-163 in the New Testament

Immediately he made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, but by this time the boat, battered by the waves, was far from the land, for the wind was against them. Pastor's Notes

Appearing on our Bulletin cover is "The Storm on the Sea of Galilee," painted in 1633 by Rembrandt van Rijn (1606-1669). Rembrandt's depiction of this event is recorded in three of the four Gospels (Matthew, Mark, and John), and it is a joy to behold!

Although the ship is painted more from Rembrandt's imagination than from any authentic depiction of sailing boats on the Sea of Galilee in the first century, the painter has nevertheless captured the drama, the intensity, indeed the terror of the storm that overtook the disciples. Rembrandt has also picked the moment in time when Jesus and Peter have just returned to the boat.

There are fourteen men in the boat. Perhaps the helmsman on the tiller is not a disciple, but Christ is clearly seated in front of him. You have to look carefully, but Peter (also identified with a halo) is sitting in front of Christ. One disciple (directly behind Paul) adds a touch of realism while vomiting over the edge of the boat. The figure to his right (the viewer's left)— the one who is looking directly at the viewer— is said to be a self-portrait of the artist. In the clear skies in the upper left of the painting, we can see a portent that the storm will quickly subside.

This masterpiece hung in the Isabella Steward Gardner Museum in Boston until 1990 when it was stolen by persons unknown. It remains missing until this day.
