

VCAM ANNUAL RAFFLE FUNDRAISER

The Victoria Christian Assistance Ministry (VCAM) has once again started selling raffle drawing tickets to support its annual fundraiser. Originally established in 1986 as a food pantry, VCAM is a non-profit organization which serves as a safety net for families in Victoria County in need of food, clothing, and other essentials.

This year's raffle drawing includes \$6,500 in prizes, including \$5,000 in HEB gift cards as well gift cards to local restaurants and retail businesses. Tickets are \$5.00 each or six tickets for \$25.00. The raffle drawing will be held at 12:00 noon, Friday, September 29, 2023, at the VCAM office.

Becky Richter, current member of the VCAM Board of Directors, will be

selling tickets at First Presbyterian Church throughout the months of August and September. Thank you for your continued support of our local outreach.

We ask for your assistance by providing dry cat food or dog food by dropping the bags off at the church. A red wagon will be located in the hallway around the fellowship hall. When you buy food for your cat or dog, please remember those that are less fortunate whose only companionship and love is their pet.



VISD Connection

This is another new and exciting outreach program of your Mission and Outreach Committee, implemented with Session approval. VISD Connection, formally known as KidzConnection, is a program affiliated with Victoria Independent School District to provide clothing and health support to the less fortunate children enrolled in our public schools who would otherwise go without basic clothing items such as shoes, jackets, backpacks, and underwear. Beginning in August 2023 our congregation will be assisting the Mission and Outreach Committee to provide basic clothing items for young girls through VISD Connection.

This Sunday you will find a special offering envelope in your worship bulletin which you can use to make a gift to this important and needed program. The Mission and Outreach Committee with use your donations to purchase needed articles of clothing to support the homeless and foster children enrolled in Victoria Independent School District.




Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these". Matt 19:14


