

During our annual Stewardship Campaign, which will run from this Sunday, August 6, 2023, through Saturday, September 30, 2023, we will be adjusting our Order of Worship a bit on each Sunday in August to remind ourselves of how poets and hymnwriters have captured the evangelical and missional aspirations of Christ's church. We will listen to the words of familiar hymns being read, or we will ourselves recite those words aloud, to hear afresh the spiritual messages they contain.

The Worship Committee hopes that by listening to the words of sacred hymns, without the music, we will be even better reminded of the work that we are to do as good stewards of Christ's church on earth.

And then on each Sunday in September, we will spend a Moment for Mission to remind ourselves of the numerous charitable organizations that the members and organizations of our church (the Presbyterian Women, our Mission and Outreach Committee, and of course our individual members) support with their time, their treasure, and their prayers.
