
OUR 2024 STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN: UPDATE

Howsoever you chose to respond, may God bless your generosity, and may your gift be used wisely in service to our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.




NEWS FROM PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN

Great news for anyone who is unable to attend monthly circle meetings at FPC, Victoria, but who would still like to participate in the Horizon Bible Study.




the Good News through sacred encounters with everyday people.






CHRISTIAN EDUCATION




PERIODIC FPC FINANCIAL REPORT TO THE CONGREGATION (JANUARY 1 THROUGH JULY 31, 2023)

I am happy to report that, through the first seven months of 2023, church revenue exceeded church expenses by \$5,796. As always, we must remain cautious even in the midst of good news. Nevertheless, this surplus is particularly encouraging, not only by its amount, but also by the fact that it indicates our members and friends have faithfully maintained their generous level of giving even over the normally sleepy summer months.
