For our Organ Anthem, Robert will be playing "The Twenty-third Psalm" by Albert Hay Malotte (1895-1964), an American pianist, organist, and composer. Malotte's most famous composition is "The Lord's Prayer," a powerful piece which Robert plays for us from time to time during our worship services and at funerals. Malotte's second most famous composition is the one which Robert will play for us this Sunday.

Many enjoy Malotte's compositions not only for their beauty but also for the moving way in which the composer has written melodies that naturally reinforce the biblical passages on which they are based. A listener familiar with the Lord's Prayer, for example, is compelled to recite the words in their mind as Malotte's majestic melody is played.

Please join us this Sunday (and why not invite a friend?!) to enjoy our ministry of music as Robert once again plays for us beautiful and inspirational music to enhance our worship.

SESSION APPROVES THREE NEW COMMUNITY OUTREACH INITIATIVES

This past Monday evening, the Session approved three great programs for you to participate in our community. Please mark your calendar for these important activities and make plans to join your brothers and sisters as we provide support and assistance to our community.

October 21, 2023 - Join the FPC, Victoria team and participate in the City of Victoria Queen City Cleanup from 9:00 to 11:00 a.m. It will be a fun time and a good way to meet others in our community who are working to make our world a better place. October 29 – November 19, 2023 – We are planning a Scavenger Hunt to support VCAM with food products for their Thanksgiving Day distribution. The object of the Scavenger Hunt will be for each of us to find a can of food in our kitchens and pantries each day based on a list of items to scavenge. A list of vegetable and fruit cans will be provided for members and friends of our church to collect each day. We will provide large brown bags and the list to scavenge. Bags can be deposited weekly on Sunday or dropped by the church office during the week. The VCAM shopping cart will be the drop off spot. More information about the Scavenger Hunt will be forthcoming in the next few weeks.

December 6, 2023 – FPC, Victoria will sponsor a Veterans Fair in partnership with the Texas Veterans Commission and the Veterans Resource Department of the Texas Workforce Commission. The goal is to inform our congregation regarding benefits available to our veterans and their families and to provide outreach and assistance to all veterans in our community.

Gina Brown, Veterans Resource Coordinator, Coastal Bend & Golden Crescent Areas representative, will organize the Veterans Fair, as well as publicize the Fair through the various veteran organization contacts available to her. She has already received commitments from Victoria Veterans Center and the Military Veterans Network. She will be working to recruit more veteran organizations to participate. To support the Veterans Fair and those who attend, FPC will provide the Fellowship Hall, bottled water, tea, and coffee.



Our congregation has responded again in a huge way helping those in our community that cannot afford to buy cat and dog food for their loving animal companions. In September we donated 136 pounds of dog food and 60 pounds of cat food to the Meals on Wheels Paw Bites program. This was about one-third of what we contributed in August, but it was gratefully accepted and appreciated by the Meals on Wheels South Texas staff.

Each time a member of our Mission and Outreach Committee delivers our church's weekly donation, the staff greets them with open arms and gives thanks for what our church does for those senior citizens they serve. They report that because of our contributions Meals on Wheels has not had to purchase cat or dog food for the past two months to meet their clients' needs!

We fell short of our goal in September. You are encouraged to join in again by purchasing an extra bag of cat or dog food for those needing our help. Our red Paw Bites wagon will continue to be in Narthex of the church for your convenience. Please remember to bring a bag of cat or dog food with you on Sunday.

Your support of this important work of God in our community is being felt in the lives of many. We do this in the name of Jesus Christ.


lessons, VFD personnel showed off their big fire trucks and other equipment-all to the delight of their young audiences.


