




PLEASE JOIN US FOR WORSHIP ON SUNDAY, MARCH 3 2024, AT 10:30 A.M.

News from the Pastor Nominating Committee

The Pastor Nominating Committee is hard at work, meeting each week—and even more often when needed—to review and evaluate potential pastor candidates. We've gone through quite a stack of candidate profiles—from all over the country—tuned in to online worship services and listened to all sorts of sermons as we humbly seek God's will for our next pastor.

We met earlier this month with Rev. Sallie Watson, general presbyter

for Mission Presbytery, who was both encouraging and complimentary of the PNC's progress. Last week we had the pleasure of meeting the church's newly appointed Commission on Ministry liaison, Rev. Cheryl Homsher. Rev. Homsher answered our questions and shared useful information and valuable insight from a pastor's perspective. We highlighted for her the PNC's work since first being elected to represent the congregation back on September 17, when we began with a one-question survey of the congregation, 'What do you think is the single most important role of our next pastor?'

Of the 41 responses, 22 answered Caregiving/Pastoral Care; 10 answered Preaching the Word; 4 gave combination answers—Nurturing the Congregation/Preaching; Teaching God's Word/Pastoring the Flock; Pastoral Care/Preaching; and Meditative Worship/Personal Contact with Members (home visits, rest homes)/Lead Bible Studies/Active in Community. Five other responses included Relating Sermons to Real-Life Situations; Leadership; Approachable; Developing New Members; and Growing the Congregation.

The responses from the congregation provided a strong foundation as we carefully developed and wrote the church profile. Called a Ministry Discernment Profile in Presby jargon, our ministry profile is posted online through the nationwide Church Leadership Connection (CLC) of the Presbyterian Church (USA). Our search for the next pastor also includes posting on the Job Board operated by the Placement Office at Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary as well as on the Mission Presbytery website and MP Weekly News. Word-of-mouth is also a valuable tool. If you are aware of a minister who is seeking a call and who might be a suitable candidate for our church, please encourage him or her to contact a member of the PNC as a self-referral,' or to go online and create a candidate profile through CLC.

Thank you for your kind words of support and encouraging prayers as we continue our journey. May our decisions and actions bring glory to God, always and forever!
