City of Victoria Bicentennial Celebration

The City of Victoria is planning to celebrate 200 years following the creation of Guadalupe Victoria by Martin De Leon in 1824. First Presbyterian Church of Victoria, Texas is the second oldest congregation in the city organized on October 2, 1841, built on lots designated by Martin De Leon for churches and schools. Your Worship, Fellowship, and Mission and Outreach Committees are working on how FPC can participate in this event to relive how our forefathers helped lead the city over the past 200 years.

VCAM

Your food keeps showing up in our food wagon in the hall by the church office and in the Narthex. Please consider bringing an extra item of canned goods or a bag of flour, sugar, rice or beans. We encourage you to volunteer. Contact the church office, Becky Richter, or Jack Klienecke about how you can spend 2-4 hours a week serving our community. It is truly a blessing, and it is actually a lot of fun.

In January, FPC donated \$380 (Poinsettia/VCAM contributions) as well as 40 pounds of food. In February, 38 pounds of food were donated, no monetary donations. VCAM needs canned fruit and vegetables, packaged rice and beans, small cans of tomato sauce, and macaroni and cheese for the food pantry. Also, items for the homeless: easy-open canned meats, nutrition bars, fruit cups, bottled water and small toiletry items.




