Paw Bites - Meals on Wheels





CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

Nellie Hudson Sunday School Class

The Nellie Hudson Sunday School class will end its six-week study of the Lord's Prayer on Easter Sunday morning. We have completed the dimensional direction of the petitions of the Lord's Prayer by looking Upward (Our Father, which art in heaven, hallowed be thy name); Inward (Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, in earth as it is in heaven); Downward (Give us this day

our daily bread); and Forward (And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us form evil). This Easter Sunday we will look Onward: What God Will Do – Resurrection Hope!

In the conclusion of this *Illuminating Lent* study, we will answer the following two questions from *The Study Catechism: Full Version* which was accepted by the 210th General Assembly of the PC(U.S.A.) in 1998.

Question 133. What is meant by the closing doxology, "For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and for ever"?

We give God thanks and praise for the kingdom more powerful than all enemies, for the power perfected in the weakness of love, and for the glory that includes our well-being and that of the whole creation, both now and to all eternity. We give thanks and praise to God as made known through Christ our Lord.

Question 134. What is meant by the word, "Amen"?

"Amen" means "so be it" or "let it be so." It expresses our complete confidence in the triune God, the God of the covenant with Israel as fulfilled through our Lord Jesus Christ, who makes no promise that will not be kept, and whose steadfast love and mercy endures forever.

We look ahead to the resurrection hope with the fullness of God's reign in the new world, in which the whole cosmos glorifies God.

Our resurrection hope in God's future is grounded in Jesus Christ. Paul praises, "But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Corinthians 15:57) then says: "Therefore, my beloved, be steadfast, immovable, always excelling in the work of the Lord, because you know that in the Lord your labor is not in vain" (15:58).

A blessed image of our resurrection hope is that in the eternal kingdom, God will "wipe every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more; mourning and crying and pain will be no more, for the first things have passed away" (Revelation 21:4)

"Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?

The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain. 1 Corinthians 15:55-58
