


HANGING OF THE GREENS


If Christians didn't worship him, they suffered.

ANGEL TREE

Presbyterian Women will once again sponsor an Angel Tree project to bring Christian Christmas joy to area children. We have partnered with Perpetual Help Home and The Salvation Army to provide Christmas gifts for 26 children, ages 8 months to 16 years old. We have 6 angels left, please grab one and help these kiddos have a Merry Christmas.

Opportunities to participate in the Angel Tree project are available to all interested Church members. The Angel Tree display is located at the front of the Church. Members can select a child's personalized name tag from the Angel Tree, and indicate your name on the sign-up sheet. The Angel Tree name tag includes the child's age, clothing sizes, "Christmas Wish List" and any helpful information that was provided to us. Reusable shopping bags are placed by the Angel Tree for storage of your gifts. The Angel Tree name tag should be attached to the reusable gift bag and returned to the church when you have finished shopping. If you do not wish to select a name from the Angel Tree, you can participate in the Angel Tree project by donating money for toys, clothing, bath towels, toothbrushes, or gift cards. Gift-wrapping materials are also welcome.

Suggested price for gifts is \$25.00 +. Please provide batteries for toys or electronic devices that are battery operated. Gifts should **not** be wrapped. Unwrapped gifts should be labeled with the child's name and assigned number. Gift bags with unwrapped gifts may be brought to Church on Sundays, or to the Church office during the week. Gifts may also be delivered to the home of Wesley and Frances Miller. All Angel Tree gifts must be received by Sunday, December 8.




Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these". Matt 19:14
